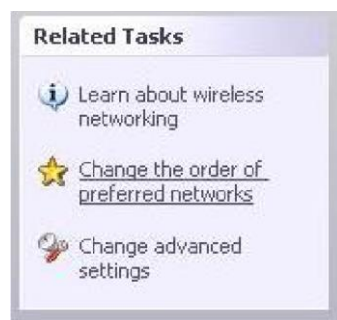


Manually Configuring **eduroam** -- Windows XP

1. On your **Desktop**, right-click on the wireless icon located in the System Tray on the bottom right of the screen, and click **View Available Wireless Networks**



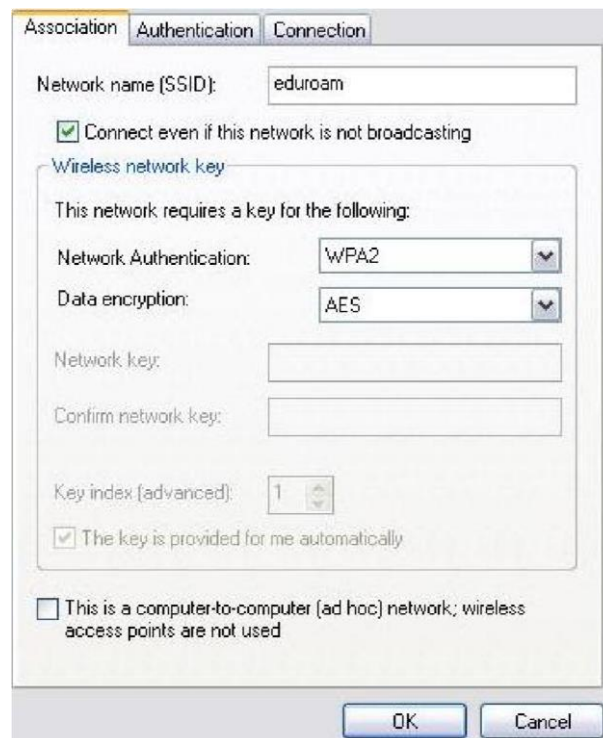
2. On the left hand side, click **Change the order of preferred networks**



3. Under **Preferred networks** click **Add..**



4. On the **Association** tab, enter the details as shown below



5. Click on the **Authentication** tab. Under **EAP type** select **Protected EAP (PEAP)**, and make sure to uncheck **Authenticate as computer when computer information is available**, as below.



6. Still on the **Authentication** tab click **Properties**, and in the window that pops up, check the box beside **AddTrust External CA Root**, as below.



7. Next, click **Configure..** and make sure the option **Automatically use my Windows logon name and password (and domain if any)** is *unchecked*. Then click OK/Close until all windows are closed and you are back at your desktop.



8. Assuming you are in range of the **eduroam** network, your computer should now attempt to connect, but will tell you that additional information is required. When this appears, click on the message.



9. A popup box should now appear for authentication details. Enter your username and password based on the following format. If you are unsure of your username, contact your campus IT helpdesk. *Note: the **Logon Domain** field should be left **blank**.*

10. You should now be connected to the network, denoted by the wireless icon in the system tray now showing green waves and flashing.
